



Summary of JoyRide COVID-19 Infection Control Plan for New Volunteers, Riders, and Staff.

1. All new staff will be asked to familiarize themselves with infection control policies as part of their onboarding.
2. All new staff and volunteers will complete the OSHA hand washing, mask wearing and biohazard removal trainings.
3. All new riders will complete a separate COVID-19 related risk/benefit assessment and the families will be educated on the JRC infection control policies and procedures.
4. All JRC staff have a shared responsibility to maintain cleaning standards both personally and across the facility.
5. All staff need to alert to any possible infection control breaches and signs of infection both in themselves and across the board in other staff, volunteers, and riders/families.
6. Any possible concern should be brought to the attention of the DO immediately.
